Organizations and other entities that have received a standing invitation from the General Assembly, interested intergovernmental organizations and other interested international bodies, associate members of regional commissions and the United Nations system

I. Participation

- 1. In accordance with paragraph 5 of General Assembly resolution 78/272, the following organizations and other entities are invited as observers to the Commission:
 - Organizations and other entities that have received a standing invitation from the General Assembly pursuant to its relevant resolutions to participate, in the capacity of observer, in its sessions and work;
 - Interested global and regional intergovernmental organizations and other interested international bodies that were invited to participate in any of the following conferences and summits:
 - World Summit on Sustainable Development;
 - United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development;
 - United Nations conferences on the sustainable development of small island developing States;
 - United Nations Conference on Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks;
 - Review Conference on the Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 relating to the Conservation and



- Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks;
- United Nations Conferences to Support the Implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 14: Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development;
- The following associate members of regional commissions: American Samoa, Anguilla, Aruba, Bermuda, the British Virgin Islands, the Cayman Islands, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Curaçao, French Polynesia, Guam, Montserrat, New Caledonia, Puerto Rico, Sint Maarten, the Turks and Caicos Islands and the United States Virgin Islands; and
- Relevant specialized agencies, as well as other organs, organizations, funds and programmes of the United Nations system.

II. Registration

2. The organizational meeting of the Preparatory Commission will be held in person at United Nations Headquarters in New York. It will not be possible to follow this meeting virtually.

Organizations and other entities that have received a standing invitation from the General Assembly

- 3. Registration of representatives of organizations and other entities that have received a standing invitation from the General Assembly pursuant to its relevant resolutions to participate, in the capacity of observer, in its sessions and work will be carried out by the United Nations Protocol and Liaison Service.
- 4. Those who have an office in New York or have already enrolled in the online e-Registration system may submit their requests via the online "e-Registration system" at https://edelegate.un.int. Information regarding the e-Registration system can be found at https://www.un.org/dgacm/en/content/protocol/meetings. Online requests for registration to the organizational meeting of the Preparatory Commission must be received by 7 June 2024.
- 5. Those which do not have an office in New York or have not enrolled in the e-Registration system should follow the registration procedure below to obtain a United Nations grounds pass.

- ii. Complete an SG.6 form for each member of the delegation (the SG.6 form can be found at https://www.un.org/dgacm/en/content/protocol/meetings).

- iv. Transmit a copy of the letter to the Division for Ocean Affairs and Law of the Sea (Att. Mr. Bingzhuo Li, email: bingzhuo.li@un.org, copied to doalos@un.org).
- 6. Requests for registration following the procedure outlined in paragraph 4 above must be received by **3 June 2024**. The Secretariat will not be in a position to process late registrations.
- 7. The focal point will be notified of the registration approval(s) via email. A hard copy of that email must be presented by the participant together with a valid passport or government photo ID to the United Nations Pass and Identification Unit (located on the ground floor of the FF Building, at 320 E. 45th Street) for the issuance of a UN grounds pass.

Interested intergovernmental organizations and other interested international bodies

- 8. Representatives of interested global and regional intergovernmental organizations and other interested international bodies that were invited to participate in relevant conferences and summits (see resolution 78/272, para. 5) are required to register through the Indico portal. Representatives may do so by creating an account at https://indico.un.org/register and registering for the meeting at https://indico.un.org/event/1011314/. signed by the head of the organization, with the names and functional titles of the delegation attending the meeting.

- 11. Requests for registration through the Indico portal must be received by **3 June 2024.**
- 12. Participants will be notified via email once their registration request has been approved. A hard copy of that email must be presented by the participant together with a valid passport or government photo ID to the United Nations Pass and Identification Unit (located on the ground floor of the FF Building, at 320 E. 45th Street) for the issuance of a United Nations grounds pass.

Associate members of regional commissions

- 13. Representatives of associate members of regional commissions are required to follow the following registration steps to obtain a United Nations grounds pass:

Submit a letter to the Protocol and Liaison Service (see details below), stamped and signed by an authorized official, with the names and functional titles of the delegation attending the meeting.
