

### Gender distribution of staff in the Professional and higher categories

#### As of 31 December 2010, women in the UN system constituted:

- **40.3%** (12,005 out of 29,763) of all staff in the professional and higher categories with appointments of one year or more(UG-P2)
- **29.3%** (784 out of 2,674) of all staff at the **D-1 level and above**(UG-D1)
- 41.1% (11,221 out of 27,089) of all staff at the **P level**(P5-P2)

Gender balance has only been achieved at the P-2 level(57.3%).

#### As of 31 December 2010, women in UNRWA constituted:

- **42.5%** (74 out of 174) of all staff in the professional and higher categories with appointments of one year or more(UG-P2)
- 21.4% (6 out of 28) of all staff at the **D-1 level and above**(UG-D1)
- **48.1%** (63 out of 131) of all staff at the **P level** (P5-P2)

**Gender balance** has only been achieved or exceeded at UG level(50.0%),P3level(62.2%), P2level (100.0%).

# Trends in the representation of women in the Professional and higher categories – 2001 to 2010

<u>Largest increase</u>: UG (15.2 percentage points from 15.6% in Dec 2001 to 30.9% in Dec 2010) Smallest increase: P-2 (4.0 percentage points from 53.3% in Dec 2001 to 57.3% in Dec 2010) Largest decrease: D1 (-2.1% percentage points 33.3% in Dec 2001 to 31.3% in Dec 2010)

<u>Largest increase:</u> P-2 (62.5 percentage points from 37.5% in Dec. 2001 to 100.0% in Dec. 2010)
