



<ul> <li>As of 31 December 2010, women in the UN system constituted:</li> <li>40.3% (12,005 out of 29,763) of all staff in the professional and higher categories with appointments of one year or more (UG-P2)</li> <li>29.3% (784 out of 2,674) of all staff at the D-1 level and above(UG-D1)</li> <li>41.4% (11,221 out of 27,089) of all staff at the P level(P5-P2)</li> <li>Gender balance has only been achieved at the P-2 level(57.3%).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>As of 31 December 2010, women in WMO constituted:</li> <li>30.3% (43 out of 142) of all staff in the professional and higher categories with appointments of one year or more(UG-P2)</li> <li>25.0% (6 out of 24) of all staff at the D-1 level and above(UG-D1)</li> <li>31.4% (37 out of 118) of all staff at the P level(P5-P2)</li> <li>Gender balance has NOT been achieved or exceeded</li> </ul>
